Based on a true story, Saving Angelo tells the journey of a boy who rescues an abandoned dog by the side of the road, and once nursed back to health provides a home for it at the local firehouse. The film stars Kevin Bacon, Eric Close, Julie Gonzalo, Dana Barron and Dominic Scott Kay, produced and edited by Katina Zinner. Grampa's Cabin is a story about a three generational family who goes through an emotional journey of hope, love and forgiveness. It stars Robert Forster, Eloise De Joria and Dominic

Saving Angelo and Grampa's Cabin are only two of Zinner's many editing works. She has edited numerous award-winning, socially significant films, including Showtime's "Soldier's Girl," which won the prestigious Peabody Award and several Emmy Awards.
